As a general rule, for school fruit and vegetables, which are distributed for free (aid $100 \%$ ), the same children participate during the whole school year. For school milk, for which parents pay a contribution, a few children drop out during the school year due to loss of interest (interest seems highest in children 5-12 years old).
