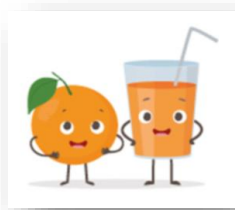

#### Comments:

An aid rates per portion of fruit and vegetables / milk are set in national regulation for school scheme. In the 2021/2022 school year, the aid rates changed twice during the school year. Rates reported in table 4.3 are weighted average taking into account different rates applied during the school year. For the report purposes rates are split into a part financed from EU budget and a part financed from national budget proportionally to the global amounts of expenditures on deliveries from EU and national budget. In school year 2021/2022 two approaches to payment system were applied. Initially, aid per portion was financed exclusively from EU budget (except VAT). Afterwards, when EU budget on deliveries had run out, expenditures on products deliveries were covered fully from national budget (including VAT). Aid rates financed from national budget given in the table are net rates.

Each school participating in the scheme is obliged to carry out at least twice in a semester educational measures from the catalogue set by the Ministry of Education. Data on the number of pupils participating in each activity comes from the questionnaire filled in by 64% of the schools participating in the scheme. In 2021/2022 from EU budget were financed: - 240 educational school visits to farms, dairies, organic farms etc. dedicated to reconnecting children to agriculture (visits covered tasting of local produce, including organic products), - 1600 workshops on healthy diet including elements of tasting classes and cooking workshops. Moreover, schools could have made use of supporting educational materials prepared in previous school years available on website <a href="http://www.programdlaszkol.org">www.programdlaszkol.org</a> (set of scenarios and tutorials for teachers, supplemented by extra educational materials dedicated to children and parents, educational films).</i>
