Local/regional purchasing	Yes	The milk supplied under the school milk regime is 100% originating from local producers. The fruits and vegetables supplied under the school fruit and vegetables regime is 25.23% sourced from local producers.
Organic products	Yes	58.6 % of the school milk distributed in 2021/2022 originates from organic production. The number is significantly higher because since 2021/2022, 0.25L white milk is only available as organic. Please note however, that the supplier for the milk regime would have been able to deliver 100% organic white plain drinking milk, however the schools decide for themselves if they decide to order organic or conventional milk. 61.8 % of the yogurt distributed in 2021/2022 originates from organic production. 35.48 % of the school fruits & vegetables come from organic production.
