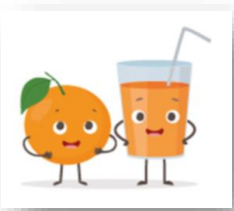

Comments	<p>Usually, in primary schools 22 weeks and in secondary schools 25 weeks. Due to COVID-19, distribution had to be halted for a longer period of time and the frequency had to be adapted/lowered.</p>	<p>Usually the entire school year but due to COVID-19 distribution stopped on 16/03 until 04/05/2020 for secondary schools (last year students only), until 11/05/2020 for all other secondary schools and until 25/05/2020 for primary schools. And thereafter, more than 2/3 of the primary schools stopped the distribution of milk and milk products for the rest of the remaining schools year. In secondary schools, food services were closed and schedules were adapted - distribution of milk via the "lunch bag" was limited.</p>
