Comments	Expenditure is broken down by product groups proportionally according to the number of portions of each product group that were supplied/distributed to children. It includes expenditures for products that could not be supplied/distributed to schools but were instead donated to charities (= cases of force majeure linked to the Covid-19 pandemic): for school fruit and vegetables, approximately EUR 1 854 264, of which EUR 1 448 463 EUR from the EU and EUR 405 801 from national funds (including VAT), for school milk, approximately EUR 302 213, of which EUR 200 978 from the EU and EUR 101 235 from national funds (including VAT). The Covid-19 pandemic affected implementation of the scheme in school year 2020/2021 in terms of number of participating children, number of distributed portions etc. Nevertheless, changes and flexibilities implemented at national level influenced positively budget execution and helped reach a relatively high level of spending in terms of EU aid (expenditure was covered from EU budget, except VAT, first).

Comments	In 2020/2021 school year, a tendering procedure was carried out for the production of educational materials for the school scheme: educational films for pupils and parents, on-line quizzes and other materials and development of a dedicated web site. Nevertheless, due to the lack of interest and valid offers, probably caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, the tendering procedure was cancelled. This prevented the full use of the budget for the accompanying educational measures in school year 2020/2021. However, the schools participating in the scheme still carried out obligatory educational measures to the extent possible in the pandemic circumstances.
