Note to the reader

The latest available consolidated trade data at EU level cover market developments in March 2023. Monthly figures can be compared with the previous month. Year-to-year change compares the cumulative trade since the beginning of the year with the same period in the previous year.

The trade figures are expressed in values, except when specifically mentioned. The unit value is the average price of products traded in the period concerned (trade value at the border divided by quantity registered).

HIGHLIGHTS: EU agri-food balance continues to improve in March, despite a rebound of imports.

In March 2023, EU agri-food trade surplus continued to progress, reaching +EUR 6.9 billion, a 28% increase month-on-month. This improvement was due to a significant increase of exports, which largely compensated a rebound of imports.

EU exports in March 2023 reached EUR 21.5 billion, a 16% increase compared to February 2023 (and 14% higher than March 2022). Cumulative exports (from January to March 2023) reached EUR 58.2 billion, a 13% increase compared to the same period in 2022. Dynamic exports for cereal preparations, preparations of fruit and nuts and dairy products led the increase for the start of the year.

Conversely, EU imports rose to EUR 14.6 billion in March, increasing by 10% month-on-month and reversing a three-month slide. Cumulative imports in the first quarter of 2023 remained 10% higher compared to the same period in 2022, primarily due to higher imports of cereals as well as oilseeds and protein crops.

EU AGRI-FOOD EXPORTS

EXPORTS CONTINUE TO GROW IN MARCH 2023

In March 2023, **EU agri-food exports** increased significantly compared to February to reach **EUR 21.5 billion** (+EUR 2.6 billion compared to March 2022, +14%). Cumulative exports from January to March were **13% higher** in 2023 (+EUR 6.7 billion), compared to the same period in 2022.

This growth in exports was led by increased exports to the **UK** since the beginning of the year. Cumulative exports value from January to March 2023 increased by 14% (+EUR 1.6 billion) compared to the same period in 2022. This growth was led by increased exports of **cereals preparation and milling products** (+EUR 359 million, +30%) and **preparations of fruits, nuts and vegetables** (+EUR 210 million, +30%).

Increased cumulative exports between January and March are also to be noted year-on-year in direction of **China** (+EUR 640 million, +19%, mainly cereal preparations), **Türkiye** (+EUR 416 million, +41%, especially beef and veal), **Saudi Arabia** (+EUR 362 million, +40%, mainly cereals) and **Ukraine** (+EUR 274 million, +45%). In the meantime, EU exports to the **US** remained comparatively stable (+5%). Some significant decreases of exports can be noticed in direction of **Egypt** (-EUR 222 million, -29%, mostly in cereals), **Iran** (-EUR 149 million, -49%) and **Tunisia** (-EUR 79 million, -28%).

EXPORTS OF SUGAR CONTINUE TO LAG IN 2023 DESPITE A REBOUND IN MARCH

Export values in the first quarter of 2023 were higher for almost all product categories compared to the same period in 2022. Exports increased in particular for cereal preparations and milling products (+EUR 1.2 billion, +24%), preparations of fruits, nuts and vegetables (+EUR 698 million, +31%), as well as dairy products (+634 million, +15%). Despite a rebound in March, cumulative export values of sugar and isoglucose remained below the level of 2022 (-7%, -EUR 11 million).

However, the results were more contrasted across categories when looking at quantities exported, as **unit values remained significantly higher** for almost all products (+15% on average on all exports).

In volume terms, exports in quarter 1 of 2023 of sugar and isoglucose decreased by 41% compared to the same period in 2022, as export unit values have increased. Large decreases were also observed for pet food and forage crops (-17%), pigmeat (-13%) and non-edible for technical use (-11%). On the other hand, exported quantities of vegetable oils have increased by 43%, as well as margarine and other oils and fats (+22%) and oilseeds and protein crops (+14%).





EU AGRI-FOOD IMPORTS

EU IMPORTS REBOUNDED IN MARCH AFTER A THREE-MONTH SLIDE

In March 2023, **EU imports of agri-food products** increased by 10%, to rise back to EUR 14.6 billion, following three months of decline. Cumulative EU imports over the beginning of the year were 10% higher (+EUR 3.9 billion), compared to the same period in 2022, with increases both in volume and unit values.

Ukraine continues to be of the main sources of agrifood imports in the EU, with stable imports month-onmonth at EUR 1.3 billion. Cumulative imports between January and March were still significantly higher compared to the same period in 2022 (+61%, +EUR 1.5 billion). It is in large part due to increased imports of **cereals** (+EUR 925 million), **oilseeds and protein crops** (+EUR 550 million), **sugar** (+EUR 105 million) and poultry and eggs (+97 million).

Cumulative imports over the first quarter of 2023 increased from the **UK** (+EUR 374 million, +11%), **Brazil** (+EUR 321 million, +9%), the **US** (+EUR 308 million, +10%) and **Canada** (+299 EUR million, +53%, mostly due to a tripling of **cereals** imports) in comparison to the same period in 2022.

Imports from **Russia** were much below their 2022 level on that period (-44%, -EUR 365 million), due to reduced imports of vegetable oils, cereals, cereal preparations and oilseeds and protein crops.

Reduced imports were also observed from **China** (-EUR 166 million, -8%), **Moldova** (-EUR 134 million, -40%) and the **Philippines** (-EUR 111 million, -31%).

EU IMPORTS OF CEREALS REMAINED HIGH IN MARCH

Cumulative import values of **cereals** (+EUR 14.9 billion, +67%), **oilseed and protein crops** (+EUR 861 million, +16%), as well as **tobacco products** (+EUR 423 million, +57%) increased on the first quarter of 2023 compared to 2022. Imports of **sugar and isoglucose** more than doubled over the same period compared to 2022 (+EUR 310 million). On the contrary, imports of **vegetables oils** (-EUR 385 million, -16%), **mixed food preparations** (-EUR 133 million, -8%) and **margarine and other oils and fats** (-EUR 94 million, -8%) decreased.

In volume terms, imports of **sheep and goat** (+29%, mainly from **UK** and **New Zealand**), **poultry and eggs** (+25%, mainly from **Ukraine** while **UK** has decreased), and **vegetables** (+18%, especially from **Egypt**) also increased over the first quarter of 2023 compared to 2022. Imports decreased for **pigmeat** (-18%, mainly from **UK**), **cereal preparations** (-17%, mainly from **Russia**), **beef and veal** (-16%, mainly from **Argentina**) over that period, while they increased in value, a sign of their inflated unit values.


