Comments	For School fruit and vegetables the applicants can choose between using free, written material provided by the Danish Agricultural Agency, or they can apply for aid to activities, planned by the applicants themselves, which has to be approven by the Danish Agricultural Agency in advance. The funds not used for educational meassures are used for products. That can be done since school fruit is a commitment scheme, where schools apply for commitment to grant before the school year begins. Therefore we can se how much of the budget will be used for each post. We have one challenge: the applicants often overbook, when they apply for the commitment, why some of the budget never gets used.	Applicants can use the Danish Agricultural Agency's free written material, which is made available og the agencys website. The material is used horizontally, and can therefor also be used in school fruit. The applicant can also choose to use their own material or activities, but aid is not gives for this. Denmarks national stragegy states, that op to 15 % of the budget can be reserved for educational meassures.
