
National tax system as a tool to rectify income volatility

→ Smoothing taxable income
Creating savings to deal with unexpected events


How does it work?



- Beneficiaries
- Thresholds to be respected 27,000 € per year; up to 150,000 €
- Conditions to use the DPA
- Reintegration



Tax Deduction for adverse events in France



Under special conditions, DPA can be used:

- To purchase fodder
- To pay insurance premium (up to the due amount)
- In case of climatic events, diseases, environmental incidents
- In case of fire, crop damage, loss of livestock
- In case of loss of value added (up to the amount of the loss)

Tax Deduction for adverse events in France

How could we encourage the use of the DPA?



- Still not widespread (2013: 5800 farms;
- Other competing tax schemes
- Possible ways forward
 - removing the annual threshold
 - decreasing the minimum blocked amount
 - more flexible conditions to use the DPA
 - removing penalties
- **Building a sound risk management toolkit**
