Remediation activities: building & rehabilitating schools, delivering birth certificates, providing school materials, parental literacy trainings, supporting income-generating activities, etc.



Policy recommendations to further enhance implementation of business commitments

 Ambitious and fair EU policy framework that supports supply chain collaboration in dialogue with third countries and that works for farmers

• EU to incentivize **end-to-end transparency** in global agri-supply chains to ensure accountability of each player

 EU-wide regulation on mandatory human rights and environmental due diligence as part of a holistic policy toolbox
