Wine sector is facing several challenges

Increasing prices and supply difficulties/shortages are impacting the wine sector :

Vineyard:

Vine plants, Stakes and wires for trellis, fertilizers, pesticides

58% of winegrowers affected by the increase in prices for fertilizers

Packaging:

glass bottles, caps, screw, labels, carton box

78% of winegrowers affected by the increase in supply times and/or prices for transparent glass bottles Transport:

Fuel

Delivery costs

89% of independent winegrowers in France are affected by the increase in delivery costs

For all the winegrowers:

+ 16% on average

Max +121%

OVERALL IMPACT ON THE SELLING PRICE OF A BOTTLE: 0,75 euros 13% of the sales price before tax 2021 per bottle on average (Vignerons Indépendants de France, May 2022)
