What's the OECD?

- ❑ *Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development*
- ❑ *Like-mindedness, on three basic principles:*
 - Democracy
 - Rule of law
 - Market economy
- ❑ *Analysing components of economic governance: statistics, trade, projections*
- ❑ *Began with Marshall Plan: now 34 countries and opening up*
- ❑ *A forum for debate, peer review & making recommendations*

What does the OECD do in agriculture?

- ❑ *Monitoring and Evaluation of policies*
- ❑ *Market monitoring (Outlook, with FAO)*
- ❑ *Improved Performance of Policies (productivity, innovation, risk management, country reviews)*
- ❑ *Development (trade, global food security, enabling environment)*
- ❑ *Evaluation of agri-environmental policies*

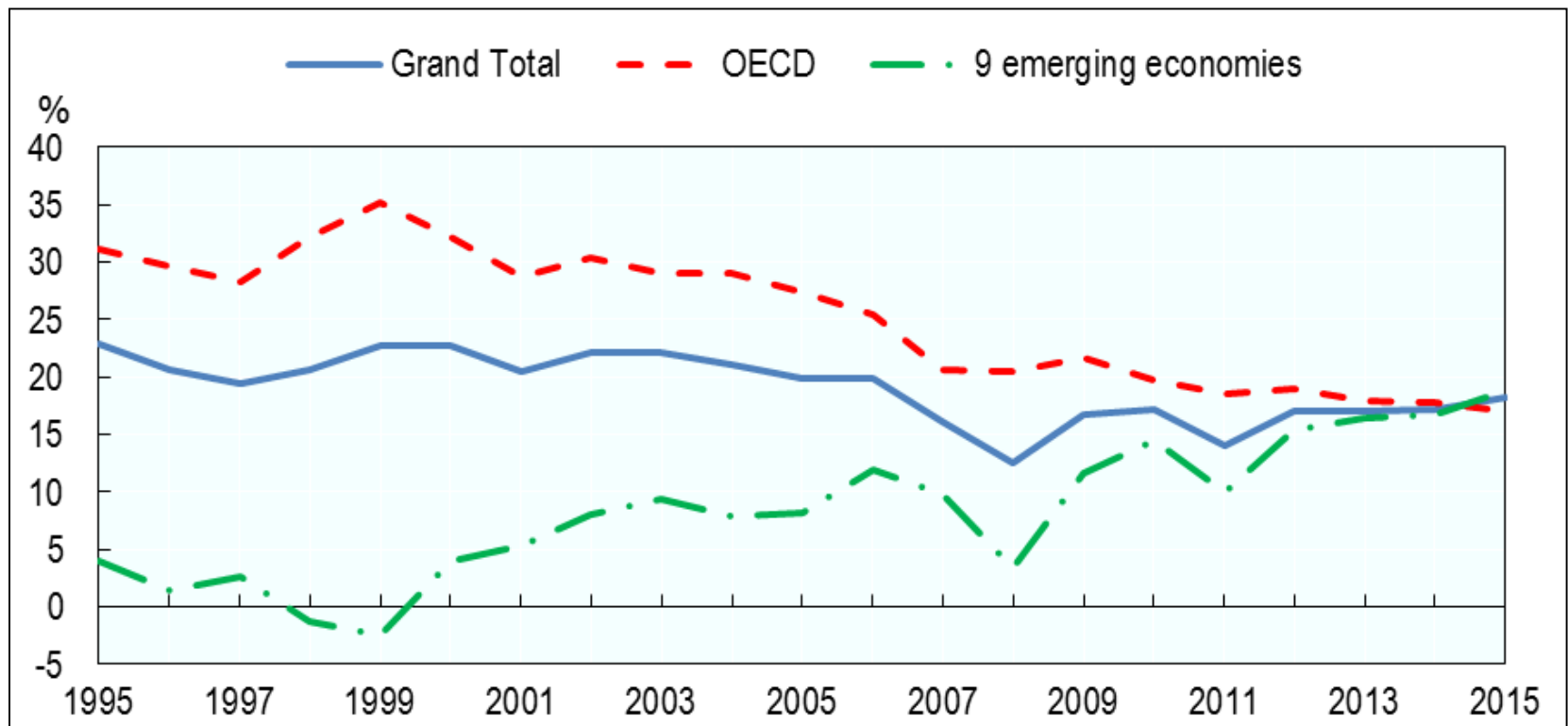
How does OECD evaluate ag policies?

"Total" support to agriculture (TSE) is calculated as the sum of:

- ☐ *The part of support to consumers that benefits producers (CSE)*
- ☐ *Direct (€) support to the farming sector (GSSE)*
- ☐ *Direct (€) transfers to producers + Indirect (€ equivalent) support from market price support (MPS) = Producer support (PSE)*

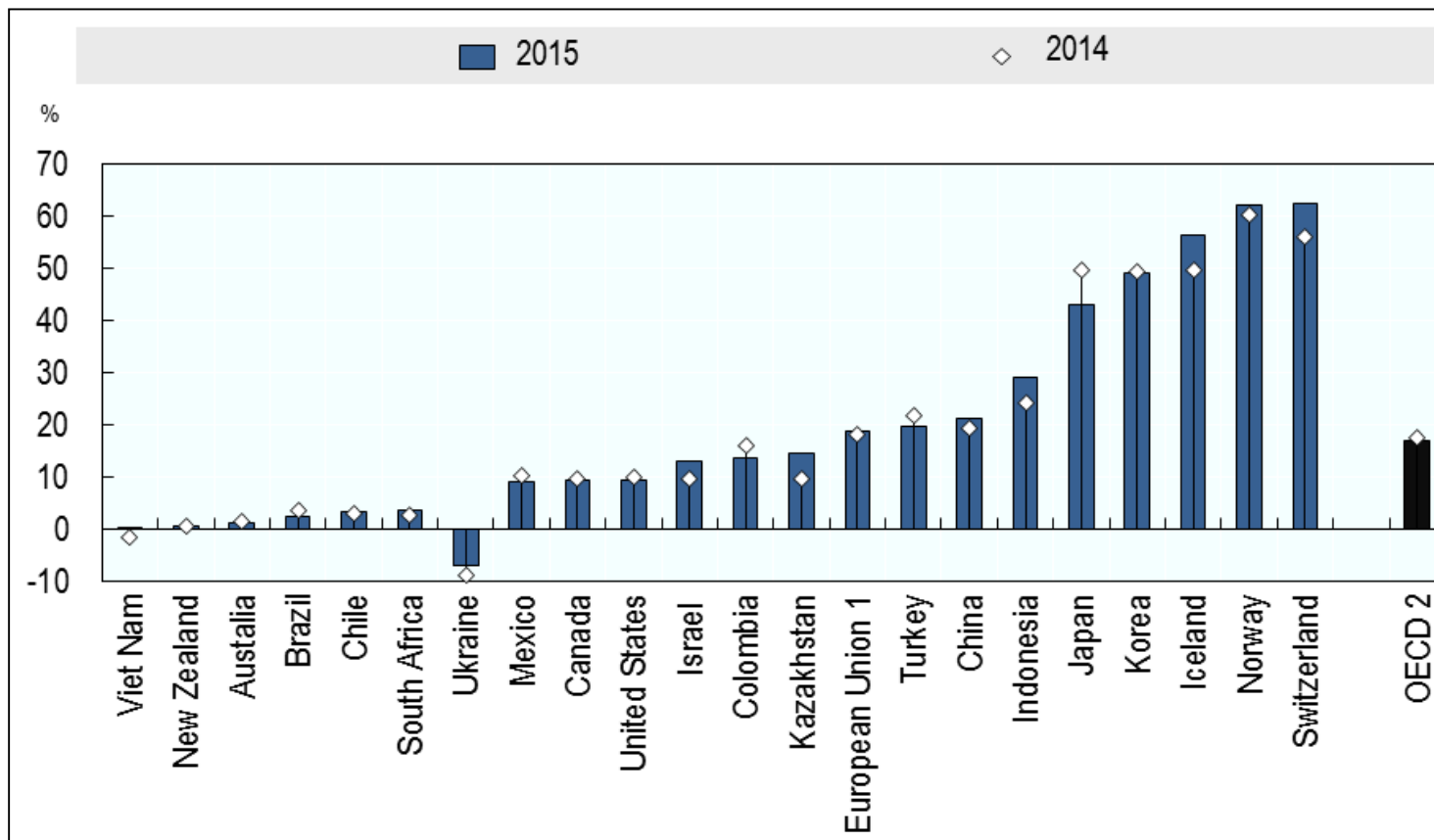
1. Producer support is decreasing in the OECD and increasing in emerging countries

Percentage of gross farm receipts



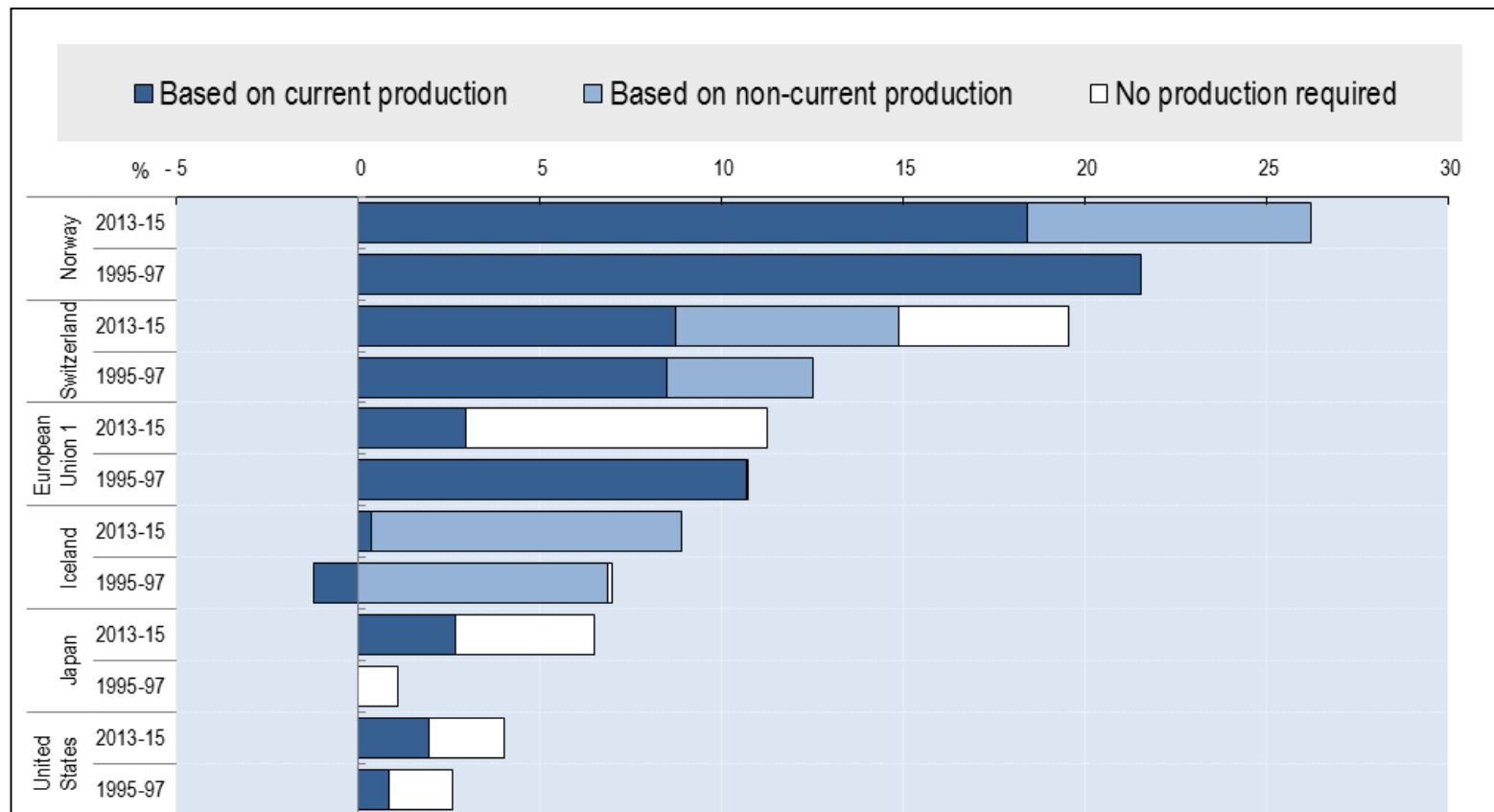
2. Switzerland, Norway, Iceland, Korea and Japan have the highest support to producers

Figure 1.6. Producer Support Estimate (PSE) by country (% GFR)



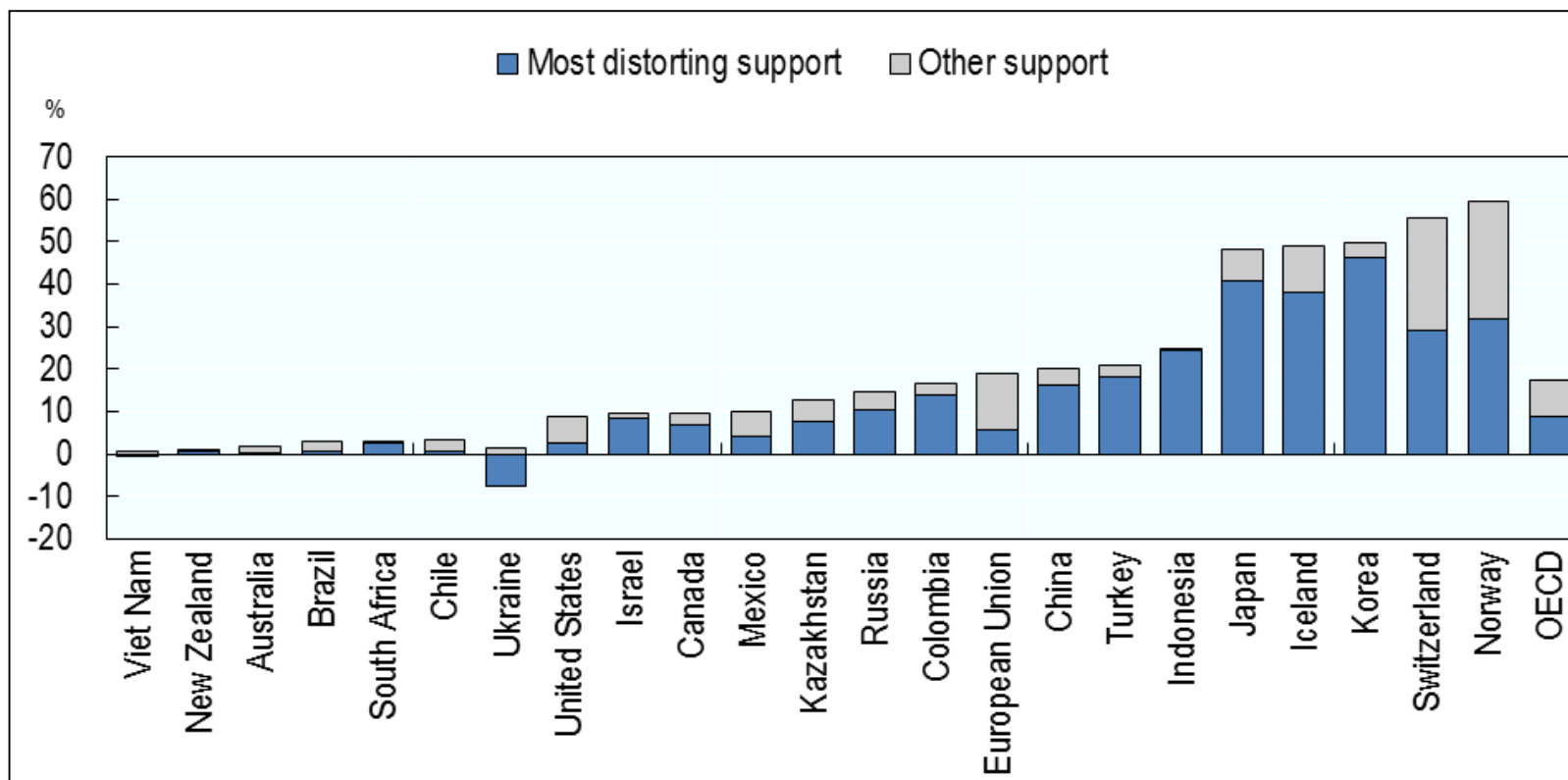
3. EU has the highest share of support not requiring production

Figure 1.10. Composition of Producer Support Estimate (PSE) by country (% GFR)




4. Australia, Chile, EU and US have the lowest share of most distorting support
