

THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLES SECTOR IN EUROPE



Production: production for <u>fresh market</u> > 70 mio T, worth ca 35 billion € , 60% sold "locally"

Intra-EU Trade: a "safe" bank to secure diversity of assortement => 30 mio T worth ca 33 billion €

Export: international relevance for market stability and access to world market: 95% of consumers are out of EU => 7 mio T worth 8.5 billion €

Import: complete assortment with off-season and tropical products => 14.5 mio T worth 15.5 billion €

Business turnover: > 250 billion € across suuply chain





F&V SECTOR SUSTAINABILITY JOURNEY IN TIME OF CRISES

Russian embargo

- 7,5 billion € for Western good
- 5 billion € covered EII agricultural products.
- 2, 5 billion € of fruit and vegetables
- 1,2 billion € of Polish fresh produce exports



- Succession of events and crises requiring sector's repositioning :
 - Event and crisis of the last decade
 - Moving towards of process of "deglobalization
 - Adapting to EU strategies such as Green deal and Farm to Fork bringing along:
 - Opportunities: already engaged in a sustainability journey for > 20 years, plant diet, sector part of the solution due to its assets
 - Challenges: reduction target of PPP without alternative solutions, organic markets under pressure, costs of adaptation, competitiveness of the sector in global environment...

- > Sector at EU level is struggling within a changing environment:
 - Food security and food lose are at stake
 - Rising costs is questioning profitability (energy, labor, ppp, packaging, certfication..)
 - Short term issues challenge the success of long-term EU strategies and objectives

Positive role of EU F&V sector to sustainable production and sustainable food system =>




- ✓ Engaged for > 20 years in sustainable production: IPM, GAP certification, testing and monitoring, compliance with private standards...




«F&v with the lowest water footprint»-Water footprint Netwotk
