Honduras and Guyana: FAO has worked with indigenous peoples' groups to develop and pilot a Free, Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC) protocol

Liberia:

 raise awareness of good forest governance principles

Thailand

- address legal land tenure challenges
- strengthen smallholders' access and capacity to participate in legal timber trade



CLARIFICATION OF LAND AND FOREST TENURE

Guyana:

harmonize forest land mapping and verification systems for managing forest concessions


Tunisia:

pilot tools to map forest boundaries and record overlapping land claims





LEGAL AND POLICY REFORM




Côte d'Ivoire:

- identify inconsistencies across sectoral legislation
- develop implementing decrees for the Forest Law to address timber legality and deforestation challenges.

Ghana: Timber Resource Management and Legality Licensing **Regulations**

- identify land suitable for granting timber rights
- terms and conditions timber rights and licensing





ENGAGING THE SMALL-SCALE PRIVATE SECTOR

Lao People's Democratic Republic:

- increase competitiveness of small and medium sized enterprises
- pursue legality compliance and production and marketing capacity

Viet Nam:

- strengthen capacities of smallholders, state-owned forest companies, and forest management boards to pursue sustainable forest management and certification, particularly for plantation forests
- meet timber legality requirements








INCREASING DATA AND TRANSPARENCY

- FAO has supported 50+ countries to develop robust National Forest Monitoring Systems
- Within FLEGT VPAs: Timber Legality Assurance Systems
 - on-the-ground timber legality verification and independent third party monitoring



DATA REVOLUTION





OPEN TIMBERPORTAL: Public access to information

 Many countries publish their national forest products data on public web geoportals



SEPAL cloud based platform:

- easy access to satellite imagery, including high resolution
- super computer facilities to process data and produce analyses fast



ACTION AREAS FOR MOVING FORWARD

- 1. Enhance inclusive stakeholder dialogue, and empower communities to exercise rights to resources
- 2. Support country-level planning, including cross-sectoral land use planning, which involves forestry, agriculture, and other land uses that drive deforestation
- 3. Strengthen the enabling environment for sustainable investment through incentives to small and medium businesses to improve market access
- 4. Increase coordination between efforts to address governance
