	<i>Due to the fact that schools have a legal autonomy in Austria, it is impossible to oblige them to participate to accompanying measures or to use certain teaching materials.</i>		
	<i>All schools and Kindergartens participating in the programme have the opportunity to participate in the accompanying measures. On the website of AMA and in the guidelines written by AMA there are links free of charge to the EUfunded teaching materials for fruit and vegetables and to other material suitable to accompany pedagogically the supply of products.</i>		
	<i>In addition to this, the schools and Kindergartens participating in the programme have the opportunity to participate in farm visits or tasting classes, as long as the budget is not depleted. However, an obligation to participate is not possible from the legal point of view, as it would constitute interference in the school autonomy and, moreover, it is not ceiling of 15 % for accompanying measures. The participation in farm visits or tasting classes is not completely refunded, but via a lump sum which does not cover all costs e.g. the very expensive transport costs. For this reason the children/teenagers from low-income families cannot be forced to participate. Schools are invited to use teaching materials free of charge.</i>		
	<i>So, as its impossible to oblige schools to participate to accompanying measures, the idea was to reserve 15 % of the budget for accompanying measures in the hope that this budget would be used for that purpose. In this case Austria would have performed the maximum possible to implement accompanying measures, but unfortunately the applications for aid didn't reach this level.</i>

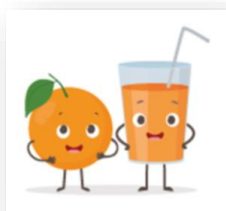

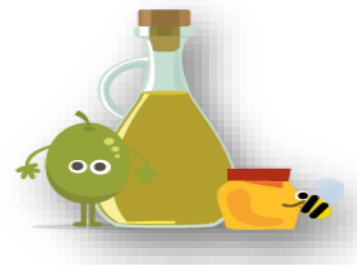
