Local/regional purchasing	Yes	The milk supplied under the school scheme is 100% from local producers. The fruits and vegetables supplied under the school scheme is 25.49 % sourced from local producers.
Organic products	Yes	26.5 % of the school milk distributed in 2020/2021 originates from organic production. The supplier would have been able to deliver 100% organic drinking milk however the schools decide whether ordering organic or conventional milk. 57 % of the yoghurt distributed in 2020/2021 originates from organic production. 23.57 % of the school fruits & vegetables come from organic production.

Comments	In primary schools school fruit and vegetables are delivered and distributed once per week to the children. In secondary schools the school fruit is delivered always on Mondays. The fruits are distributed on the 5 weekdays.	Supply: The schools are supplied at least once per week, and around 20% of the schools are supplied twice a week, depending on the quantities needed. Distribution: The distribution frequency to kids depends on the internal organisation of each school. (For 2020-2021 the participating schools had self-reported that 27.2% would distribute milk/milk products on 1 day/week: 7.4% on 2 days/week: 4.9% on 3 days/week: 6.25% on 4 days/week: and 54.3% on 5 days/week (a school week is equal to 5 days /week))

Usually the entire school year but due to the COVID-19 crisis, schools had to be closed from 8th to 21st February 2021. (One week of school holidays included). Because of the school closures, 1745L of Milk had been donated to charity associations in order to prevent food waste.
