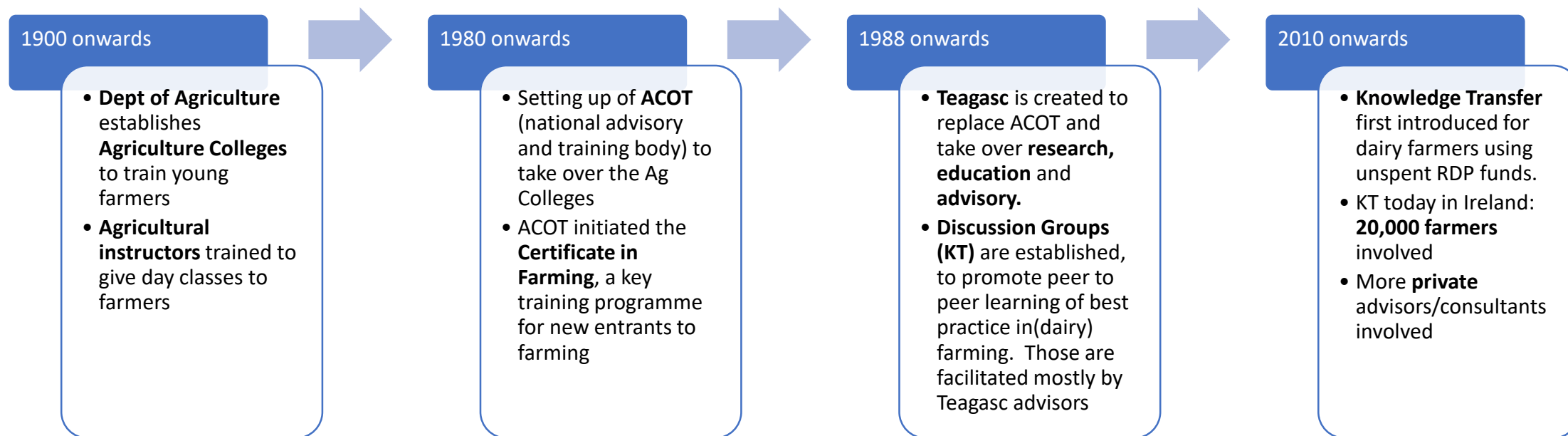

# 11 members – farmers/farmer orgs prevalent

Chairman (farmer)

3 x Representatives of Farm Organisations (farmers)

1 x Representative of ICOS (farmer)

2 x Representatives of universities

1 x Representative of DAFM

2 x Representatives of agri-food industry

1 x Representative of Teagasc staff

# Teagasc Budget and Expenditure

## Funding from:

- State grant-in-aid; fees for research; advisory and training services; national and EU competitive research programmes; revenue from farming activities; commodity levies.

## Budget:

2017: €145m + €33.5m earned income

75% National Exchequer + EU funds

## Expenditure:

40% = Research

30% = Advisory

30% = Education



# Teagasc – The Agriculture and Food Development Authority

- Teagasc = farm advisory services in Ireland
- Provides **independent, world class production research**:
  - Moorepark – Dairy (also some processing research there in collaboration with industry)
  - Grange – Beef
  - Oakpark – Crops
- Provides **independent advisory services**
- Runs **Agricultural Colleges**

# Concerns re. FAS (Teagasc and Private)

- **Greater reliance on Discussion Groups/KT** for advisory (20,000 farmers, 1,200 KT/Discussion Groups – each facilitated by a Teagasc or Private consultant)
- Loss of **one-to-one**, customised advice
- Increasing role of consultants in helping farmers **fill CAP related application forms** (Area Aid, Basic Payment...)
- But – little input from FAS in **problem solving** around those
- KT payments going through advisory service - **restricts farmers' negotiation power** on consultancy/advisory fees
