WHAT IS A SINGLE DOCUMENT?

Applications for protection of names as designations of origin or geographical indications shall include a **Single Document** which is:

- a summary of the product specification,
- a self-standing document.

To prepare a Single Document:

- Member States should use the screens in the IT tool eAmbrosia
- Producers from a Third Country should use the template laid down in Annex I of Regulation (EU) 2019/34



WHO CAN APPLY FOR PROTECTION?

Any interested **group of producers** or in exceptional and duly justified cases a single producer

[Article 95 R. 1308/2013; Article 3 of R. 2019/33]



A 'single producer': justification needed!



HOW TO DRAFT A SINGLE DOCUMENT?

The Single Documents should be:

- Concise
- Precise and specific in wording
- Avoiding exaggerated terms, unfounded statements, subjective description (ex. "unique microclimate", "specific taste", "perfect", "the best"...)





Name of a region, a specific place or a country (in exceptional and duly justified cases)





NAME

 To be written in the script of the language used to describe the product; if not in Latin, add a Latin transcription

"Μαντινεία" / "Mantinia" (PDO)

Could be a traditionally used name (as an exception and a PDO only!)








DESCRIPTION OF WINES

- Specific description
- Avoid general terms (fine, aromatic)
- Use a language of a wine expert, a chemist and/or agronomist
- Description of the wines and not of the grape varieties (except for mono-varietal wines)



ESSENTIAL OENOLOGICAL PRACTICES




- **Specific** practices only!
- Relevant restrictions [Article 94 (2)(c) R. 1308/2013]



MAXIMUM YIELDS

- ▼ Single document
 - X Cover page
 - X Categories of grapevine products
 - X Description of the wine(s)
 - ▼ Wine making practices
 - X Specific oenological practices
 - X Maximum yields





- In hectolitre per ha and/or
- In kilograms of grapes per ha
- No separate yields required for all types of wines

[Article 94 (2)(e) R. 1308/2013]



DEMARCATED AREA

- Precise, detailed and unambiguous
- Easily identifiable for control purposes
- Regions, communes, villages, administrative areas (polygon, parcel, cadastre, landscape features...)

[Article 6 of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/34]



- No reference to external documents (e.g. legal acts)
- No demarcation limited to a single estate




X Main wine grapes variety(ies)



- All the authorised main wine grape varieties should be mentioned: main wine grapes (Single Document) and secondary wine grapes (Other information) [Art. 94 of R. 1308/2013]
- The main wine grapes are those which are essential to the characteristics of the wine



THE LINK



The link = essential part of Single Document

How the specificities of the geographical area influence those of the wine = the causal link

Describe the link for **EACH** <u>category</u> of grapevine products



DESCRIPTION OF THE LINK

- 1. Identify and describe the characteristics of the defined geographical area (natural and human factors):
 - => Include only those characteristics that have influence on the wine
- 2. Identify and describe the wine characteristics which make the wine different compared to similar products:
 - => Include only features of the product that have a relation to the geographical area
- 3. Show how the features of the wine are the result of the factors present in the area:
 - => Give an objective reasoning that links the specificities of the area and of the wine

DESCRIPTION OF THE LINK

NATURAL FACTORS

Describe the **soil**, **climate**, **mineral elements**, **land sculpture**, etc. and **how they influence** specific characteristics of the wine

HUMAN FACTORS

Describe specific **skills and know-how, traditional practices,** etc. and **how they influence** specific characteristics of the wine

DISTINCTIVENESS

Geographical area should have **specific characteristics** giving specific characteristics to the product



DESCRIPTION OF THE LINK

For a PGI, state whether the link is based on specific quality, reputation of other characteristics attributable to the geographical area


In case that the link is based on reputation (only for a PGI!):

- Show that the reputation of the product is linked to the name and attributable to the geographical area
- Provide proof of this reputation

ESSENTIAL FURTHER CONDITIONS





ESSENTIAL FURTHER CONDITIONS

Objective, non-discriminatory, compatible with EU Law

Only for **specific** rules and derogations – Do **not** include the obligatory EU or national rules

Different types of further conditions:

- ✓ **Derogation** on production in the demarcated area
- ✓ Packaging within the demarcated area
- ✓ Labelling provisions
- ✓ Other

[Articles 4(2), 5 and 55 of R. 2019/33]



ESSENTIAL FURTHER CONDITIONS

DEROGATIONS CONCERNING THE WINE PRODUCTION IN THE DEMARCATED GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

- in an area in the immediate proximity
- in an area located within the same or neighbouring administrative unit
- trans-border PDO/PGI

[Article 5 of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) No 2019/33]

SPECIFIC RULES ON LABELLING

- include only those which are <u>not</u> laid down in the legislation
- do not include optional labelling



ESSENTIAL FURTHER CONDITIONS SPECIFIC RULES ON PACKAGING

If packaging of the product, including bottling takes place **within** the demarcated geographical area or within an area in the immediate proximity, **justification is needed!**


JUSTIFICATION for the specific case may be based on:

- safeguarding quality
- ensuring the origin
- ensuring control

[Article 4(2) of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/33]



DECLARATION OF CONFORMITY



DECLARATION OF CONFORMITY to be included by the Member State: a statement that the application for the registration of the wine name complies with Regulation (EU) No 1308/2013.
