Comments	With regard to the school milk part of the scheme, suppliers provides accompanying measures on voluntary basis and using private resourses (without any EU or national support). The Paying Agency does not collect data on the amount of private resourses used for such purposes. With regard to the school fruit part of the scheme, expenditure was lower than planned as due to the COVID-19 pandemic primary schools functioned online from 8 March to 19 April 2021 - lower primary schools children returned in class from 19 April and upper primary schools children from 10 May. Several schools were therefore not able to carry out all planned 4 tasting sessions.
