Note to the reader

The latest available consolidated trade data at EU level cover market developments until July 2022. Monthly figures can be compared with the previous month. Year-to-year change compares the cumulative trade since the beginning of the year with the same period in the previous year.

The trade figures are expressed in values, except when specifically mentioned. The unit value is the average price of products traded in the period concerned (trade value at the border divided by quantity registered).


HIGHLIGHTS: EU AGRI-FOOD TRADE SLOWED DOWN IN JULY 2022 – BUT STILL AT HIGH LEVEL

Both EU agri-food exports and imports slowed down in July, in value terms. This resulted in a stable **trade balance at EUR 4.9 billion**, compared to June.

EU **exports** stayed high at **EUR 19.2 billion**. This is a small decrease compared to June (-2%), but still significantly higher compared to last year. The biggest decline came from less dynamic exports of fruit, vegetables and olives. Despite the decline in overall exports, exports of cereals, most particularly wheat but also barley, increased particularly to the MENA region.

EU **imports** reached **EUR 14.3 billion** in July 2022, a -2% decrease compared to the previous month. EU imports from main partners have actually increased in July (mainly from Brazil, the UK, the US and Ukraine) but dropped from many other countries, as notably from China, Argentina and the MENA region.







EU AGRI-FOOD EXPORTS

EU EXPORTS TO MENA REGION INCREASE

In July 2022, EU agri-food exports slightly declined (by 2% month-to-month) in value terms. Commodity prices continue to decrease in July. The FAO food price index dropped by 9% to reach 140.6, but was still 13% higher than last year (July 2021).

EU agri-food exports to the **MENA region** increased the most month-to-month. The biggest increase was recorded for wheat, in volumes (+70%). EU exports of other coarse grains (including barley) increased substantially in July as well (+157%). This means that the EU exported 1.9 million t of wheat in July and 857 thousand t of coarse grains. It is respectively +300% and +84% compared to July of last year.

Instead, EU exports of cereals to **sub-saharan Africa (SSA)** declined (-43%). This comes after a surge in exports of EU cereals to SSA in June 2022, particularly of wheat. Generally, EU agri-food exports to SSA declined to reach EUR 1 billion (-30% month-to-month). On top of the decline in cereals, exports of poultry meat, SMP and beef and veal also fell.

Trade developments in January-July 2022


Total EU exports since the beginning of the year (until July) reached EUR 127 billion. This is 14% above last year's same period.

WITH THE FRESH EU HARVEST, CEREALS ON TOP OF THE EXPORTED PRODUCTS

In July 2022, exports of **cereals** continued to dominate the EU total export values. The EU exported for EUR 2.3 billion. Second highest value in EU agri-food exports in July were **cereals preparations and milling products**, followed closely by exports of **dairy products** (EUR 1.8 billion).

The dynamic in cereal exports was led by an overall increase in volumes (+46%), and registered a drop in prices (-7%) compared to June. **Wheat** exports reached 3 million t, a 74% increase compared to July last year. Compared to June, wheat exports increased by 21% in volume terms and the unit value dropped by 4%.

On the other end, exports of certain categories declined in July. This was the case for **fruit and nuts** (-EUR 69 million, -15%) and **vegetables** (-EUR 59 million, -10%), which registered their second and fourth consecutive decline, respectively. Specifically, the biggest declines were noted for **apples and pears** (to the UK and Egypt), **citrus** and for **potatoes** (to the UK and Switzerland). **Olives and olive oil** exports dropped by EUR 67 million (-14%) in July, largely due to the decline of exports to the US.



EU AGRI-FOOD IMPORTS

EU IMPORT BILL EASED IN JULY 2022

EU imports declined for the second month in a row in July to EUR 14.3 billion (-2.2%), although still at high level. Imports from Argentina, Morocco and Turkey declined month-to-month. At the same time, EU imports from major trading partners increased, notably from Brazil and the US as well as from Malaysia. EU imports from Ukraine continue their fourth consecutive month of growth.

EU imports from **Brazil** increased by 8% in July compared to June 2021, mainly due to increased imports of maize (+492%) and soya cakes (+35%) in value terms. This was largely due to an increase in volumes imported in the EU. Maize imports reached in July a record high (685 thousand t).

Imports from **the US** increased in July due to a sharp increase of soya beans imports as well as nuts. Soya beans imports from the US increased by 158% to reach EUR 231 million in July. This was driven by a rise in imported quantities (354 thousand t, +163% month-to-month). Nuts imports also increased in volume terms (53 thousand t, +16%).

The steepest increase in EU imports from **Malaysia** in July 2022 came from palm oil. They reached EUR 217 million (+57% month-to-month). This is only due to a rise of quantities imported in the EU and compensates for the reduction of imports from Indonesia, due to a 3-weeks export

ban and difficulties to resume appropriate levels of imports.

Trade developments in January-July 2022

Total EU imports since the beginning of the year (until July) reached EUR 96 billion. This is 33% above last year's same period.


EU IMPORTS DECLINED BUT DYNAMIC SOYA, NUTS AND PALM OIL

In July 2022, imports of soya beans, nuts and palm oil increased month-to-month. **Soya beans** imports reached EUR 871 million (+7%) for 1.3 million t. These came mainly from Brazil (at a higher price compared to June) and the US (at a lower price).

Nuts imports reached EUR 604 million (+6%) for 150 thousand t. Nuts imports came mainly from the US and Vietnam at respectively a stable and higher price compared to June.

Palm oil imports reached EUR 592 million (+20% month-to-month) for 404 thousand t. These largely came from Malaysia and Indonesia at a relatively similar price compared to June.

Imports of grapes, sunflower seeds and bananas decreased the most in July (month-to-month). They respectively declined by 24% (to reach EUR 58 million), 20% (EUR 240 million) and 18% (EUR 232 million).


EU trade with the United Kingdom in January-July 2022

The United Kingdom has become the first trading partner with the EU. The total exchange of agri-food products reached EUR 53.8 billion in 2021. Relative to this, the second trading partner is the US for which trade worth EUR 33.8 billion in 2021.

Cereal preparations and milling products are the primary category in EU-UK agri-food trade. The EU traded in 2021 EUR 5.8 billion of these products with the UK. The second most traded food items are dairy products. The main dairy products traded are cheese and curd, fresh dairy products and butter.

In 2022, total agri food trade increased substantially between the EU and the UK. For the first seven months in 2022, the agri-food trade expanded by 21%, to reach EUR 35.5 billion, compared to the specific situation beginning 2021 when the EU-UK Trade and Cooperation Agreement entered into force.

EU exports to the UK have increased by 17% to reach EUR 27 billion in January to July 2022. The steepest increases, in value terms, were for cereal preparations and milling products (+22%), Poultry and eggs (+40%) and dairy products (+21%).



EU imports from the UK also increased and reached EUR 8.4 billion (+35%) in the first seven months of 2022. This is almost at pre-Brexit levels (still -2% compared to January-July period in 2020). The biggest increase was recorded for spirits and liqueurs (+35%), dairy products (+55%) and cereals (+159%).
